Day 1: Airport – Galle (Approx. 5 hrs)

On arrival in Sri Lanka International airport, you will be met by your chauffeur guide and transferred to the hotel in Galle (Approx. 5 hrs) where you could relax and spend the day at leisure and get rid of any jetlag you may have.



Day 2: Galle

After an early breakfast/ packed breakfast, drive with your Naturalist guide to Mirissa Harbour (Approx. 40 mins) and start your journey to the sea in a spacious and comfortable boat. Of the 80 species of cetaceans observed and identified worldwide, 26 are found in the Indian Ocean and the Bay of Bengal. The most commonly sighted are the blue whales and the sperm whales. If you are lucky enough, you will also get a chance to observe over five hundred dolphins swimming around your boat.



Spend the rest of the afternoon at leisure enjoying the hotel facilities.

Day 3: Galle

After an early/ packed breakfast, you will be taken to the Mirissa harbour for another whale watching session. Today, you will be mainly focusing on dolphins. The long-snouted spinners are a treat to watch in action along with Spotted Dolphins, Spinner Dolphins, and Fraser's Dolphins.



The rest of the afternoon at leisure enjoying the hotel facilities.

Day 4: Galle

Spend the day sightseeing at the historically important city of Galle. . Its rich heritage is derived from the colonial influences of the Portuguese, Dutch and the British respectively, spanning four centuries. Galle was a key harbour city for centuries, hence its value to successive colonial superpowers. The town's centrepiece is the World Heritage listed Dutch Fort, around which the city is built. The Fort was initiated and partially constructed by the Portuguese, which was then expanded upon quite significantly by the Dutch. The Fort remains a hive of activity and is one of the few World Heritage listed sites in which a bustling population continues to thrive.



If you like some beach time, you may visit the Unawatuna beaches, which has some of th best beaches of Sri Lanka.

Day 5: Galle

You will be enjoying more whale watching today, which will be your last time to capture some great photographs to preserve the memories.



Day 6 : Galle – Departure (Approx. 5 hrs)

Transfer to Bandaranaike International Airport (Approx: 5 hrs)

NOTE: Whale watching boat trips only operate in favorable sea/weather conditions and usually only between November and April.
